National Bishop Baiguele, Pastor Touka, and Apollonaire formed a panel to discuss and answer questions about the use of mother tongue Scriptures, hymnals, liturgies, and devotions in the life of a congregation and its pastor. Pastor Kuhn was the moderator for this event.



There were several opportunities for language groups to discuss the use of Scripture in their own mother tongues.



There were also several fun events including a movie night, a talent show, and a football (soccer) match between pastors who graduated seminary in odd and even years. (The odd years team won!)



I brought greetings from all of you, supporters of LBT Canada, and presented gifts of LBTC hats to the National Bishop, guests, and all those who helped make this retreat such a joyous and meaningful event.

The women of the Belel Parish danced into the retreat setting several times bringing an abundance of edible gifts to show their support for the pastors. At one of these processions I received a beautiful chicken!
