2023 Special Projects Update

Of the five Special Projects for 2023 two have been fully funded.

#5 Mother Tongue Resources for Prison Ministry

It is so exciting to hear that the New Testaments and full Bibles that have been translated are being distributed by EELC prison chaplains and used for Bible

study groups and worship times in Cameroonian prisons.

Praise God that His Word is at work in more and more people's lives.

#4 iDelta Training

Three years ago Pastor Ousmanou (Nizaa translator) was offered the opportunity to take this continuing education training in Bible translation and Scripture engagement. His experience

was so positive that LBTC decided to see if funds could be raised for another Cameroonian translator to take this training. It didn't take long for two donors to come forward with enough funding for two people to participate in the next iDelta session.

Praise God for these generous people who are enabling people to gain more skills to work in the fields that are ripe for the harvest.

Potential Translation Projects Update

Pastor Kuhn reports that he is hearing from many language communities their desire for the Bible in their own heart language. Some of these groups are well organized and have the whole community primed and ready to begin a translation project. Many of these already have some Scripture in their

mother tongues. In other language groups the organization isn't in place, but need is great and the people's hunger for God's Word is so apparent.

Thailand Concordia Lutheran Church (TCLC) Bishop Dr. Ted NaThalang reports that Southern Thai survey work has begun in two ways. First, Pastor Suchard has begun leading worship and preaching in Southern Thai in his congregation. He is then gauging the reactions of his members to see how receptive they are to this use of their heart

language.

Second, Pastor Yongtanayot recorded Luke 2 in Southern Thai to be broadcast on various media platforms. He too is gauging people's reactions and receptiveness to hearing the Scriptures in Southern Thai.

Please pray for Southern Thai people to receive God's Word in their hearts and for these pastors as they make begin to use Southern Thai in their ministry.
