


CAMEROON

SURAM learning

Another happy change in our work concerns the SURAM project that has been featured in a number of our recent prayer letters. We are in the final stages of report writing and preparing for publication. That means that our research findings are already known and I can start sharing some with you all!

One of our biggest findings is that more people report regular use of mother tongue Scriptures than those who report owning mother tongue Scriptures. This is interesting for two reasons. First, it shows that Cameroonian believers use their mother tongue Scriptures in group settings (like in-home devotions, church groups, and Bible listening groups). Second, could you imagine if four out of five Canadian Lutherans were reading Scripture at least a few times per week? That would be exciting! And that is what people report is happening in the communities where we did our research. **Praise God for that, and may His Word produce growth and fruit as it is being used!**

Big changes, same God!

The theme of this letter has been "things that are constant and things that change." One constant that I failed to mention off the top is the most important of them all; *our God*, *His enduring presence, His abundant love and grace, and His abiding Word are an ever-present reality for all of us.* In fact, even death's days are numbered (1 Cor 15:54-55) and the tax man won't come calling after the Last Day. More than that, Scripture teaches us that heaven and earth will pass away, but that His word will never pass away. (Mt 24:35) Never! Isn't that a wonderful truth to stand on? In a world of constant change, please pray with us that the bedrock of God's Word would give us all (including those we work among!) a firm foundation on which to stand.

Another big change for us is that we no longer have a volunteer teacher for our homeschool. So, Kara has been getting back into her homeschool groove as we now have four homeschoolers from kindergarten to 9th grade. Plans have been made, materials purchased, and kids orientated to new topics and schedules... is it exciting or daunting? Both!
